On behalf of the National Marine Manufacturers Association (NMMA) Canada, I would like to express our group's strong support for the possible expansion of services on the Trent-Severn Waterway for the upcoming boating season. NMMA has actively supported the increase in hours on various waterways with the government in the past, particularly as it related to the Rideau Canal, and is pleased to see a possible expansion of services is being considered for the Trent-Severn Waterway.

NMMA was equally pleased to see in Budget 2014 that Parks Canada has invested over \$390 million to make improvements to highways, bridges & dams located in national parks and along our historic canals, which will facilitate better access which includes the Crow Bay Dam on the Trent-Severn Waterway. This investment will also have a positive economic impact on local businesses (including many of our organization's members) and tourism stakeholders.

As you may know, NMMA Canada is a national, not-for-profit association that represents the recreational boating industry in Canada. Comprised of over 90 members in Canada and over 1300 in the United States, our member companies produce more than 80 percent of the boats, engines, trailers, accessories and gear used by North American boaters. The recreational boating community has revenues of \$8.9 billion and a GDP of \$5 billion. The core of the industry employs about 70,000 Canadians across the country.
